

40 Days of Prayer for Spiritual Renewal

Introduction



The **Renew Montana Network** is a collective of pastors and church leaders from every region of Montana who are passionately *pursuing a culture of spiritual renewal* together. We have forged this collaborative network because we long to see *a movement of renewed churches who effectively advance the kingdom* with joy. We believe the epicenter for the revitalization of Montana churches is a spiritually renewing culture, so our desire is for you and your church to experience the power and presence of the risen Christ. We believe God can transform any church that fully submits to Him.

Renewal begins with you!

The Renew Montana Network is built on three **strategic values**.

- **Pursuing Christ** – We **delight** in Christ as a compelling testimony of His grace
- **Pursuing His Community** – We are **devoted** to one another as a compelling witness
- **Pursuing His Commission** – We are **dependent** on the Holy Spirit in our compelling mission

These strategic values form the framework of this 40-day prayer guide. We believe our identity in Christ inspires a spiritually renewing culture through the empowering of the Holy Spirit. We pursue Christ as **worshippers** who bask in the joy of the Lord. We pursue His Community as the **family** of God who encourage, edify, and equip one another for His glory. We pursue His Commission as **missionaries** commissioned by God to reflect His goodness and grace. We believe that as we pursue each identity in Christ, we will mature as believers and model the essential elements of a spiritually healthy church.

Spiritual Renewal is the gracious work of the Holy Spirit in the heart and mind of the believer, but it is not received passively. It is an intentional pursuit! Therefore, the practice of spiritually renewing disciplines is crucial to quicken a deeper affection for Christ, spur a love and loyalty for His people, and propel us to kingdom-living as gospel witnesses. Over the next 40 days, the aspiration of the Renew Montana Network is for the Lord Most High to kindle a fresh fire of spiritual renewal in your soul. May God refresh your spirit to live with **purpose, passion, purity**, and the **right priorities**. We pray this outpouring of the Holy Spirit will permeate your church and overflow into your community.

We encourage you to gather weekly in small groups to share what God is revealing to you for mutual benefit and pray together. A **small group guide** is in the appendix as a model for integrating this 40 Days of Spiritual Renewal in your discipleship process.

We also strongly recommend integration of this spiritual renewing process into your **weekly worship gathering**. Allow time for a testimony. Incorporate highlighted Scripture among the songs. Provide prayer prompts for quiet moments of prayer. Offer a pastor-led prayer as a model of worship-based prayer.

This **40 Days of Prayer for Spiritual Renewal** is the first step of our **Renew Montana Process**. We want to see every church renewed and continually experiencing renewal. In the appendix you will find the stages of our church revitalization process: **Renew, Reevaluation, Revitalization, Replant**.

Day 1: An Overview of Pursuing a Culture of Spiritual Renewal

This **40 Day Prayer Guide** is designed for you have a daily encounter with God through meditating on Scripture. As you read each passage, allow a few moments for the Word of God to saturate your heart and ponder deeply what God is revealing. Each day, questions are offered to stimulate reflection. As you listen to God's voice, respond to the prompting of the Holy Spirit through worship-based prayer. The benefits of believing what is true, thinking what is right, and living intimately with God are immense!

*The law of the Lord is perfect, **reviving the soul**; the testimony of the Lord is sure, **making wise** the simple; the precepts of the Lord are right, **rejoicing the heart**; the commandment of the Lord is pure, **enlightening the eyes**; the fear of the Lord is clean, **enduring forever**; the rules of the Lord are true, and **righteous altogether**. More **to be desired** are they than gold, even much fine gold; **sweeter** also than honey and drippings of the honeycomb. Moreover, by them is your **servant warned**; in keeping them there is **great reward**. (Psalm 19:7-11 ESV)*

Over the next 40 days, we pray the Lord will transform your **heart posture** and heal emotional wounds. May you release anxiety and abound in hope and peace. May you replace insecurity with the confident assurance of God's presence and steadfast love. May the Lord redeem your grief and lead you to grace and turn your sorrow to joy. May the Holy Spirit change your heart to reflect humility, submission, generosity, and thanksgiving. For our heart posture to change, we must **remember, repent, rejoice, and repeat!**

*Bless the Lord, O my soul, and all that is within me, **bless his holy name!** Bless the Lord, O my soul, and **forget not** all his benefits, **who forgives** all your iniquity, **who heals** all your diseases, **who redeems** your life from the pit, **who crowns** you with steadfast love and mercy, **who satisfies** you with good so that your youth **is renewed** like the eagle's. (Psalm 103:1-5 ESV)*

***Purge me** with hyssop, and I shall be clean; **wash me**, and I shall be whiter than snow. Let me hear joy and gladness; let the bones that you have broken rejoice. **Hide** your face from my sins, and **blot out** all my iniquities. **Create in me** a clean heart, O God, and **renew** a right spirit within me. **Cast me not** away from your presence, and **take not** your Holy Spirit from me. **Restore to me** the joy of your salvation, and **uphold me** with a willing spirit. (Psalm 51:7-12 ESV)*

Over the next 40 days, we pray the Lord will restore a biblical **mindset** in you. May you live with an eternal perspective as a citizen of heaven. May you be consumed with the glory of God and reclaim a sense of awe and wonder for the holiness of God. May you recognize the spiritual battle that wages war against you, and may you live with faith that God is working through trials and hardship to produce endurance in you. Again, for our mindset to change, we must **remember, repent, rejoice, and repeat!**

***Rejoice** in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice. Let your reasonableness be known to everyone. **The Lord is at hand**; **do not be anxious** about anything, **but in everything** by prayer and supplication **with thanksgiving** let your requests be made known to God. And the **peace** of God, which surpasses all understanding, **will guard your hearts and your minds** in Christ Jesus. Finally, brothers, whatever is **true**, whatever is **honorable**, whatever is **just**, whatever is **pure**, whatever is **lovely**, whatever is **commendable**, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. (Philippians 4:4-8 ESV)*

Journal what is on your heart as a prayer to the Lord. Be open and honest. Express your hurt, frustration, doubt, concerns, and needs. Turn these over to the Lord. **Remember** who you are in Christ. **Repent** of the sinful heart postures, mindsets, or behaviors that quench the Holy Spirit. **Rejoice** with a grateful heart.

Day 2 – Pursuing Christ requires preparing your mind for action.

As you meditate on the selected passage, contemplate the words and phrases that speak to you about preparing your mind for action.

1 Peter 1:13-21 (ESV)

Therefore, **preparing your minds for action**, and being sober-minded, **set your hope fully on the grace** that will be brought to you at the revelation of Jesus Christ. As obedient children, **do not be conformed** to the passions of your former ignorance, but as he who called you is holy, you also be holy in all your conduct, since it is written, “**You shall be holy, for I am holy.**” And if you call on him as Father who judges impartially according to each one’s deeds, **conduct yourselves with fear** throughout the time of your exile, knowing that you were **ransomed from the futile ways** inherited from your forefathers, not with perishable things such as silver or gold, but with **the precious blood of Christ**, like that of a lamb without blemish or spot. He was foreknown before the foundation of the world but was made manifest in the last times for the sake of you who through him are believers in God, who raised him from the dead and gave him glory, so that **your faith and hope are in God.**

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Day 3 – Pursuing Christ requires daily dying to self.

As you meditate on the selected passage, contemplate the words and phrases that speak to you about dying daily to self.

Luke 9:23-26 (ESV)

*And he said to all, “If anyone would come after me, **let him deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me.** For whoever would save his life will lose it, but **whoever loses his life for my sake will save it.** For what does it profit a man if he gains the whole world and loses or forfeits himself? For whoever is ashamed of me and of my words, of him will the Son of Man be ashamed when he comes in his glory and the glory of the Father and of the holy angels.*

What is God revealing to you in this passage?

Why is daily dying to self essential to pursue Christ?

How must your heart posture be reshaped?

How must your mindset be adjusted?

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Day 4 – Pursuing Christ requires hearing and following His voice.

As you meditate on the selected passage, contemplate the words and phrases that speak to you about hearing and following Christ.

John 10:1-15 (ESV)

*“Truly, truly, I say to you, he who does not enter the sheepfold by the door but climbs in another way, that man is a thief and a robber. But he who enters by the door is the shepherd of the sheep. To him the gatekeeper opens. **The sheep hear his voice, and he calls his own sheep by name** and he leads them out. When he has brought out all his own, he goes before them, **and the sheep follow him**, for they know his voice. **A stranger they will not follow**, but they will flee from him, for they do not know the voice of a stranger.”* This figure of speech Jesus used with them, but they did not understand what he was saying to them. So Jesus again said to them, *“Truly, truly, I say to you, **I am the door of the sheep**. All who came before me are thieves and robbers, but the sheep did not listen to them. I am the door. If anyone enters by me, he will be saved and will go in and out and find pasture. The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy. **I came that they may have life and have it abundantly. I am the good shepherd**. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. He who is a hired hand and not a shepherd, who does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and flees, and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. He flees because he is a hired hand and cares nothing for the sheep. I am the good shepherd. **I know my own and my own know me**, just as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and **I lay down my life for the sheep**.”*

What is God revealing to you about the Good Shepherd?

Why is hearing and following the voice of Jesus essential for spiritual renewal?

What outside voice, heart posture, or mindset is keeping you from pursuing Christ?

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Day 5 – Pursuing Christ requires being transformed by Christ.

As you meditate on the selected passage, contemplate the words and phrases that speak to you about transformation through submission to Christ.

Romans 12:1-2 (ESV)

*I appeal to you therefore, brothers, by the mercies of God, to **present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and acceptable to God, which is your spiritual worship. Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect.***

What is God revealing to you about submitting to Christ and being transformed by Him?

Why is this important in pursuing a culture of spiritual renewal?

How must your heart posture be reshaped?

How must your mindset be adjusted?

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Day 6 – Pursuing Christ requires walking in the way of the righteous.

As you meditate on the selected passage, contemplate the words and phrases that speak to you about walking in the way of the righteous.

Psalm 1:1-6 (ESV)

*Blessed is the man **who walks not** in the counsel of the wicked, **nor stands in** the way of sinners, **nor sits in the seat** of scoffers; **but his delight is in the law of the LORD, and on his law he meditates day and night.** He is like a tree planted by streams of water that yields its fruit in its season, and its leaf does not wither. In all that he does, he prospers. The wicked are not so but are like chaff that the wind drives away. Therefore the wicked will not stand in the judgment, nor sinners in the congregation of the righteous; for the LORD knows **the way of the righteous**, but the way of the wicked will perish.*

How does this text contrast the way of the wicked and the righteous?

Why is delighting in God's Word essential for spiritual renewal?

What impact does walking, standing, and sitting in/with the sinful ways of the world have on your heart posture and mindset?

What fruit do you desire from pursuing Christ?

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Day 7 – Pursuing Christ requires valuing Him above all else.

As you meditate on the selected passage, contemplate the words and phrases that speak to you about the surpassing worth of knowing Christ.

Philippians 3:7-14 (ESV)

*But whatever gain I had; I counted as loss for the sake of Christ. Indeed, I count everything as loss because of the **surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord**. For his sake I have suffered the loss of all things and **count them as rubbish**, in order that I **may gain Christ** and be **found in him**, not having a righteousness of my own that comes from the law, but that which comes through faith in Christ, the **righteousness from God that depends on faith**— that I may **know him** and **the power of his resurrection**, and **may share** his sufferings, **becoming like him** in his death, that by any means possible I **may attain** the resurrection from the dead. Not that I have already obtained this or am already perfect, but I **press on** to make it my own, because Christ Jesus has made me his own. Brothers, I do not consider that I have made it my own. But one thing I do: **forgetting what lies behind** and **straining forward** to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus.*

What is God revealing to you about the surpassing worth of knowing Christ?

How must your heart posture be reshaped to become like Christ?

How must your mindset be adjusted to have this eternal perspective?

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Day 8 – Pursuing Christ requires a hunger and thirst for Him.

As you meditate on the selected passage, contemplate the words and phrases that speak to you about being satisfied by God alone.

Psalm 63:1-8 (ESV)

O God, you are my God; earnestly I seek you; my soul thirsts for you; my flesh faints for you, as in a dry and weary land where there is no water. So I have looked upon you in the sanctuary, beholding your power and glory. Because your steadfast love is better than life, my lips will praise you. So I will bless you as long as I live; in your name I will lift up my hands. My soul will be satisfied as with fat and rich food, and my mouth will praise you with joyful lips, when I remember you upon my bed, and meditate on you in the watches of the night; for you have been my help, and in the shadow of your wings I will sing for joy. My soul clings to you; your right hand upholds me.

What is God revealing to you in this Psalm about the Lord?

What must God do in you to experience renewal in this way?

What convicts you or challenges about being satisfied by God alone?

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Day 9 – Pursuing Christ requires divine power for life and godliness.

As you meditate on the selected passage, contemplate the words and phrases that speak to you about the power Christ gives us for life and godliness.

2 Peter 1:3-11 (ESV)

*His **divine power has granted to us all things that pertain to life and godliness**, through the knowledge of him who called us to his own glory and excellence, by which he **has granted to us his precious and very great promises**, so that through them you may **become partakers of the divine nature**, having escaped from the corruption that is in the world because of sinful desire. For this very reason, make every effort to supplement your faith with virtue, and virtue with knowledge, and knowledge with self-control, and self-control with steadfastness, and steadfastness with godliness, and godliness with brotherly affection, and brotherly affection with love. **For if these qualities are yours and are increasing, they keep you from being ineffective or unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ.** For whoever lacks these qualities is so nearsighted that he is blind, having forgotten that he was cleansed from his former sins. Therefore, brothers, be all the more diligent to confirm your calling and election, **for if you practice these qualities you will never fall.** For in this way there will be richly provided for you an entrance into the eternal kingdom of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.*

What is God revealing to you about His divine power?

Why is “making every effort” important in your pursuit of Christ?

Which of the qualities from this passage do you believe you are lacking in your life?

What steps of obedience are required to be fruitful?

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Day 10 – Pursuing Christ requires setting your mind on things above.

As you meditate on the selected passage, contemplate the words and phrases that speak to you about setting your minds on things above.

Colossians 3:1-10 (ESV)

*If then you have been raised with Christ, **seek the things that are above**, where Christ is, seated at the right hand of God. **Set your minds on things that are above**, not on things that are on earth. For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ who is your life appears, then you also will appear with him in glory. **Put to death** therefore what is earthly in you: sexual immorality, impurity, passion, evil desire, and covetousness, which is idolatry. On account of these the wrath of God is coming. In these you too once walked, when you were living in them. But now you must **put them all away**: anger, wrath, malice, slander, and obscene talk from your mouth. Do not lie to one another, seeing that you have put off the old self with its practices and have **put on the new self**, which is being renewed in knowledge after the image of its creator.*

What is God revealing to you?

What heart posture, behavior, or mindset must be “put away” or “put on” for you to be conformed to Christ and renewed in knowledge after the image of your creator?

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Day 11 – Pursuing Christ requires knowing and living in the love of Christ.

As you meditate on the selected passage, contemplate the words and phrases that speak to you about experiencing the love of God.

Ephesians 3:14-21 (ESV)

*For this reason I bow my knees before the Father, from whom every family in heaven and on earth is named, that according to the riches of his glory he may grant you to be **strengthened with power through his Spirit** in your inner being, so that **Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith** – that you, **being rooted and grounded in love**, may have strength to comprehend with all the saints what is the breadth and length and height and depth, and **to know the love of Christ** that surpasses knowledge, **that you may be filled with all the fullness of God**. Now to him who is able to do far more abundantly than all that we ask or think, according to the power at work within us, **to him be glory** in the church and in Christ Jesus throughout all generations, forever and ever. Amen.*

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Day 12 – Pursuing Christ requires waiting patiently for Him.

As you meditate on the selected passage, contemplate the words and phrases that speak to you about waiting patiently on God and rejoicing in him.

Psalm 40:1-8 (ESV)

I waited patiently for the Lord; he inclined to me and heard my cry. He drew me up from the pit of destruction, out of the miry bog, and set my feet upon a rock, making my steps secure. He put a new song in my mouth, a song of praise to our God. Many will see and fear, and put their trust in the Lord. Blessed is the man who makes the Lord his trust, who does not turn to the proud, to those who go astray after a lie! You have multiplied, O Lord my God, your wondrous deeds and your thoughts toward us; none can compare with you! I will proclaim and tell of them, yet they are more than can be told. In sacrifice and offering you have not delighted, but you have given me an open ear. Burnt offering and sin offering you have not required. Then I said, "Behold, I have come; in the scroll of the book it is written of me: I delight to do your will, O my God; your law is within my heart."

What is God revealing specifically to you?

Respond to the prompting of the Holy Spirit with worship-based prayer.

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Day 13 – Pursuing Christ requires worshipping Him as King.

As you meditate on the selected passage, contemplate the words and phrases that speak to you about worshipping Christ as King.

Psalm 100:1-5 (ESV)

*Make a joyful noise to the Lord, all the earth! Serve the Lord with gladness! Come into his presence with singing! Know that the Lord, he is God! It is he who made us, and we are his; we are his people, and the sheep of his pasture. Enter his gates with **thanksgiving**, and his courts with **praise**! Give thanks to him; bless his name! For the Lord is good; his steadfast love endures forever, and his faithfulness to all generations.*

What is God revealing specifically to you?

What is God revealing to you about your heart posture toward worship?

How is submission to God as Creator and Ruler essential for pursuing a culture of spiritual renewal?

Respond to the prompting of the Holy Spirit with worship-based prayer.

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Day 14 – Pursuing Christ’s Community

Over the last 13 days, you have experienced what it means to be **in Christ**. The emphasis has been on treasuring Christ and pursuing your relationship with Him. Over the next 13 days, the focus will shift to living as the body of Christ and being **united in spirit and purpose**. As you pursue Christ’s Community, the aspiration of the Renew Montana Network is that your time of Bible meditation and prayer will spur you to have a greater love and care for God’s people. The Church is an incredible gift for encouragement and edification, and our spiritual renewal is amplified as we share our spiritual gifts with the family of God. We pray your fellowship with believers will be sweet and Spirit-filled.

Often, churches are dysfunctional. They have poor communication and are plagued by personality conflicts. There is a rally cry for the gospel, but there is no power because the Holy Spirit is quenched. There is a facade of church health based on duty-driven people, but the issues of the heart are ignored. In contrast, a spiritually renewed culture breeds health and vitality. The culture of the church is founded on a **set of core values** that are Scripture driven and Holy Spirit empowered. They are modeled relationally, protected, and demonstrated by heart postures and mindsets that honor the Lord.

And he went throughout all Galilee, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom and healing every disease and every affliction among the people. So his fame spread throughout all Syria, and they brought him all the sick, those afflicted with various diseases and pains, those oppressed by demons, those having seizures, and paralytics, and he healed them.
(**Matthew 4:23-24 ESV**)

Jesus built a culture that welcomed sinners and yet was consistent with His message to repent and believe. His life demonstrated truth and compassion. It is the responsibility of every believer to **cultivate a healthy church culture**. The core values of hope, faith, generosity, and grace are reflected in how a church makes disciples, builds leaders, shepherds the flock, and lovingly serves its neighbors. One can articulate a great vision to accomplish a meaningful goal, but without a healthy ministry culture to build upon, the church will be anemic.

Put on then, as God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, compassionate hearts, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience, bearing with one another and, if one has a complaint against another, forgiving each other; as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. And above all these put on love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in one body. And be thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly, teaching and admonishing one another in all wisdom, singing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, with thankfulness in your hearts to God. And whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.
(**Colossians 3:12-17 ESV**)

Jesus prioritized people and taught the urgency of restoring relationships. When sinful attitudes and behaviors go unaddressed, they can destroy the unity of the church. A healthy church culture will lovingly and humbly confront dysfunction and disunity. Believers are to pursue purity and extend forgiveness, with reconciliation as the goal of every conflict. Our lives are to reflect the teaching of Christ.

“So if you are offering your gift at the altar and there remember that your brother has something against you, leave your gift there before the altar and go. First be reconciled to your brother, and then come and offer your gift.” (Matthew 5:23-24 ESV)

“Why do you see the speck that is in your brother's eye, but do not notice the log that is in your own eye? Or how can you say to your brother, ‘Let me take the speck out of your eye,’ when there is the log in your own eye? You hypocrite, first take the log out of your own eye, and then you will see clearly to take the speck out of your brother's eye.” (Matthew 7:3-5 ESV)

“If your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault, between you and him alone. If he listens to you, you have gained your brother. But if he does not listen, take one or two others along with you, that every charge may be established by the evidence of two or three witnesses. If he refuses to listen to them, tell it to the church. And if he refuses to listen even to the church, let him be to you as a Gentile and a tax collector. (Matthew 18:15-17 ESV)

Day 15 – Pursuing Christ’s Community requires loyal love and devotion.

As you meditate on the selected passage, contemplate the words and phrases that speak to you about life-giving practices.

Acts 2:42-47 (ESV)

*And they **devoted themselves** to the apostles' teaching and the fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. And awe came upon every soul, and many wonders and signs were being done through the apostles. And all who believed were together and **had all things in common**. And they were selling their possessions and belongings and distributing the proceeds to all, as any had need. And day by day, **attending the temple together** and **breaking bread** in their homes, they received their food with glad and generous hearts, praising God and having favor with all the people. And the Lord added to their number day by day those who were being saved.*

When a soul is rescued from the dominion of darkness and given everlasting life it is exciting, because the gospel message is a motivating force. As we pursue Christ’s Commission to make disciples of all nations, we have purpose, and we belong to a noble cause that is greater than us. This calling renews us.

Over the next 13 days, the focus of our Bible meditation and prayer will be on living dependent on the Holy Spirit in our compelling mission. It begins by knowing and relishing the heart of God who lavishes His love on us. The gospel daily renews our hope for eternal life and its abundant grace fosters gratitude. The hope and grace of the gospel compel us to worship in spirit and truth, for the wrath of God has been satisfied and sin has been defeated.

The Lord is merciful and gracious, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love. He will not always chide, nor will he keep his anger forever. He does not deal with us according to our sins, nor repay us according to our iniquities. For as high as the heavens are above the earth, so great is his steadfast love toward those who fear him; as far as the east is from the west, so far does he remove our transgressions from us. As a father shows compassion to his children, so the Lord shows compassion to those who fear him. (Psalm 103:8-13 ESV)

As you read the following parables, contemplate the heart of God for lost souls. Ponder the response of heaven when a sinner repents. Reflect on your heart posture and mindset toward this good news.

The Parable of the Lost Sheep

Now the tax collectors and sinners were all drawing near to hear him. And the Pharisees and the scribes grumbled, saying, “This man receives sinners and eats with them.” So he told them this parable: “What man of you, having a hundred sheep, if he has lost one of them, does not leave the ninety-nine in the open country, and go after the one that is lost, until he finds it? And when he has found it, he lays it on his shoulders, rejoicing. And when he comes home, he calls together his friends and his neighbors, saying to them, ‘Rejoice with me, for I have found my sheep that was lost.’ Just so, I tell you, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who need no repentance. (Luke 15:1-7 ESV)

The Parable of the Lost Coin

“Or what woman, having ten silver coins, if she loses one coin, does not light a lamp and sweep the house and seek diligently until she finds it? And when she has found it, she calls together her friends and neighbors, saying, ‘Rejoice with me, for I have found the coin that I had lost.’¹ Just so, I tell you, there is joy before the angels of God over one sinner who repents.” (Luke 15:8-10 ESV)

The Parable of the Prodigal Son

And he said, “There was a man who had two sons. And the younger of them said to his father, ‘Father, give me the share of property that is coming to me.’ And he divided his property between them. Not many days later, the younger son gathered all he had and took a journey into a far country, and there he squandered his property in reckless living. And when he had spent everything, a severe famine arose in that country, and he began to be in need. So he went and hired himself out

to^[b] one of the citizens of that country, who sent him into his fields to feed pigs. And he was longing to be fed with the pods that the pigs ate, and no one gave him anything.

“But when he came to himself, he said, ‘How many of my father’s hired servants have more than enough bread, but I perish here with hunger! I will arise and go to my father, and I will say to him, ‘Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you. I am no longer worthy to be called your son. Treat me as one of your hired servants.’” And he arose and came to his father. But while he was still a long way off, his father saw him and felt compassion, and ran and embraced him and kissed him. And the son said to him, ‘Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you. I am no longer worthy to be called your son.’^[c] But the father said to his servants,^[d] ‘Bring quickly the best robe, and put it on him, and put a ring on his hand, and shoes on his feet. And bring the fattened calf and kill it, and let us eat and celebrate. For this my son was dead, and is alive again; he was lost, and is found.’ And they began to celebrate. Now his older son was in the field, and as he came and drew near to the house, he heard music and dancing. And he called one of the servants and asked what these things meant. And he said to him, ‘Your brother has come, and your father has killed the fattened calf, because he has received him back safe and sound.’ But he was angry and refused to go in. His father came out and entreated him, but he answered his father, ‘Look, these many years I have served you, and I never disobeyed your command, yet you never gave me a young goat, that I might celebrate with my friends. But when this son of yours came, who has devoured your property with prostitutes, you killed the fattened calf for him!’ And he said to him, ‘Son, you are always with me, and all that is mine is yours. It was fitting to celebrate and be glad, for this your brother was dead, and is alive; he was lost, and is found.’” (Luke 15:11-32 ESV)

Therefore, we are **ambassadors for Christ**, God making his appeal through us. We implore you on behalf of Christ, be reconciled to God. For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.*

Day 40: A case study for a spiritually renewing culture

The book of 1 Thessalonians is a tremendous example of a **spiritually renewing culture**. The life of this church was marked by their work of faith, their labor of love, and their steadfast hope. When the gospel came to them, the Holy Spirit brought deep conviction, and the power of God to save souls was evident. In submitting to Christ and modeling the example of the Lord, they became a life-giving community. They also became a compelling testimony of the grace of God. This was reflected in their lives, relationships, and conduct. It shaped their passions and priorities. The joy of the Lord rang out from them and the fruit of this spiritually renewing culture had a far-reaching impact.

*We give thanks to God always for all of you, constantly mentioning you in our prayers, remembering before our God and Father your **work of faith and labor of love and steadfastness of hope** in our Lord Jesus Christ. For we know, brothers loved by God, that he has chosen you, because our gospel came to you not only in word, but also **in power** and in the Holy Spirit and **with full conviction**. You know what kind of men we proved to be among you for your sake. And you became **imitators of us and of the Lord**, for you received the word in much affliction, with the **joy of the Holy Spirit**, so that you became **an example** to all the believers in Macedonia and in Achaia. For not only has the word of the Lord sounded forth from you in Macedonia and Achaia, but your faith in God has gone forth everywhere, so that we need not say anything.*

(1 Thessalonians. 1:2-8 ESV)

Do you see the essential elements of this spiritually renewing culture? This is true for us today. The power of the Gospel is alive! We have incredible hope. The joy of the Lord is our strength. It sustains us and refreshes us. As we imitate Christ, the culture of our church is shaped by our convictions and our commitment to Him. This is reflected in the grace we extend, the love we show, the honor we give, the compassion we share, the disciples we make, and the example we set.

First, let us pursue Christ. Let us delight ourselves in Him. Let us exchange the futile ways of the world and desire His presence. Let us look heavenward with an eternal perspective. Everything we need, Jesus is!

For they themselves report concerning us the kind of reception we had among you, and how you turned to God from idols to serve the living and true God, and to wait for his Son from heaven, whom he raised from the dead, Jesus who delivers us from the wrath to come.

(1 Thessalonians 1:9-10 ESV)

Next, let us pursue Christ's Community. Let us devote ourselves to one another. Let us be known by our love. Let us demonstrate care and concern and be a life-giving community. Let us model the grace of God.

*But we were gentle^[c] among you, **like a nursing mother** taking care of her own children. So, being affectionately desirous of you, we were **ready to share with you** not only the gospel of God but also **our own selves**, because you had become **very dear to us**. For you remember, brothers, our labor and toil: we worked night and day, that we might not be a burden to any of you, while we proclaimed to you the gospel of God. You are witnesses, and God also, how holy and righteous and blameless was our conduct toward you believers. For you know how, **like a father with his children**, we **exhorted each one of you and encouraged you and charged you** to walk in a manner worthy of God, who calls you into his own kingdom and glory. **(1 Thess. 2:7-12 ESV)***

A spiritually renewing culture is shaped by how we disciple one another. It's the mindset we establish, the vulnerability we exhibit, the humility we model. Disciples exhort and encourage one another to live a life worthy of God for the glory of God. We submit to the authority of God's Word and submit to one another out of reverence for Christ. Our prayers bind us to the heart of God and to one another.

Finally, let us pursue Christ's Commission. As we are dependent on the Holy Spirit, our lives will be refreshed as the gospel is proclaimed. As souls respond with repentance and faith, we will rejoice with the angels in heaven. We have a compelling mission, and we have the extraordinary opportunity to share the love, joy, hope, and peace found in Christ. Demonstrate it with your words and deeds. Share your testimony of how you turned from idols (your sin and self) and embraced the true and living God. A church united in spirit and purpose magnifies the name of Jesus and seeks to make Him famous.

For not only has the word of the Lord sounded forth from you in Macedonia and Achaia, but your faith in God has gone forth everywhere, so that we need not say anything. (1 Thess. 1:8 ESV)



 - **Identifies:** Worshipper, Family, and Missionary
 - **Foundations:** Scripture, Gospel, and Prayer
 - **Structures:** Discipleship, Membership, and Leadership
 - Complete a Community Survey to discover the makeup and needs of your community.
2. Evaluate – Renew Montana Champion will review the findings with observations.
3. Empowered – Pastor-driven revitalization with relevant data from surveys and observations.

Revitalization

1. Explore – A Renew Montana Champion will guide church leaders in the process.
 - Organize a Church Summit for congregational input into the church revitalization process.
 - The Renew Montana Champion will review the findings of the church health assessment and community survey with the church, field questions and make observations.
 - What is the life cycle of the church?
 - What are the vital signs of the church?
 - The Renew Montana Champion will use discovery questions to engage the church.
 - What are the strengths, weaknesses, observations, and threats (SWOT)?
 - What is the heart of God for the lost?
 - What does it mean to be a disciple?
 - What are unique ways the church can engage community?
2. Recommendations – The Renew Montana Champion will guide the church to chart a path forward.
 - a. The outcomes of the Church Summit will determine priorities and goals.
 - b. The church creates action steps.
3. Implementation – The Renew Montana Champion supports church with resources and coaching.

Replant

When the church determines they no longer have the capacity to be a healthy church, the membership determines their next steps. This may include giving property and assets to a local SBC church, their association, or to the MTSBC for future church planting. The disbanding members are encouraged to form a prayer group for a future church. In some cases, a missional community is created to prepare the “spiritual soil” of the community for a future work.


